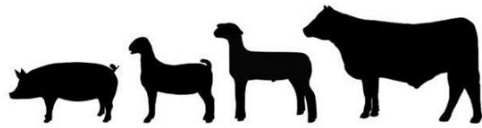

### Santa Cruz County Fair 2021 Livestock Show

#### COVID-19 Warning, Rules and Acknowledgment of Risk

- A. All Exhibitors, their family members and other related persons participating in the livestock events or on-grounds at the Santa Cruz County Fair facilities shall comply with all health and safety orders, rules and guidelines related to COVID-19 promulgated by the State of California, County of Santa Cruz, CDC, and Santa Cruz County Fair. Without limiting the foregoing, Exhibitors, their family members and other related persons participating in the livestock events agree that they will wear a face covering, wash hands frequently, use hand sanitizer or antibacterial wipes, and maintain social distancing when possible.

- B. Any individual, including Santa Cruz County Fair Staff or volunteers, showing signs, symptoms of COVID-19 are asked to stay home. COVID-19 symptoms may include but are not limited to:

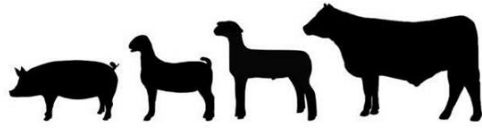
Fever or chills	Muscle or body aches	Congestion or runny nose
Cough	Headache	Nausea or vomiting
Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing	New loss of taste or smell	Diarrhea
Fatigue	Sore throat

- C. Exhibitors and their family members acknowledge that personal protective equipment (“PPE”)/Face Coverings/Facemask are designed to reduce the chances of exposure to or infection of COVID-19, may not be readily available at the SCC Fair facilities for their participation in the livestock events. The livestock area is a place where people tend to congregate in the barns and in the arena, making it difficult to maintain social distancing. Therefore, face coverings will be required while in the livestock area. Face covering must cover nose and mouth while on the premises. Exhibitors and their family members acknowledge that Santa Cruz County Fair may not, and is under no legal duty to, provide any PPE to Exhibitors or their family members. Exhibitors and their families should provide their own PPE for participation in livestock events.

- D. Exhibitors and their family members understand and acknowledge that participation in livestock events at the Santa Cruz County Fair may expose them to contact with one or more persons who have been infected with, and/or exposed to, Covid.

### Exhibitors with Covid/Covid Exposed Prior to Fair

- A. Exhibitors that are caring for someone that is sick or is at high risk for complications from COVID-19 are recommended to not attend their respective livestock show or event.
- B. Exhibitors, or someone in their household, who has tested positive for COVID-19, are asked to not attend the Santa Cruz County Fair or livestock shows. Exhibitor's market animal may still qualify for market and sale.
  - I. Covid-affected exhibitors must immediately notify the Santa Cruz County Livestock Committee/Santa Cruz County Fair of Covid Status.
  - II. To qualify for sale, Covid-affected exhibitor must provide positive COVID-19 test documentation and/or exposure notice letter.
  - III. Covid-affected exhibitor(s) may arrange for another person to bring their animal in on weigh-in day. Animal is to be vet-checked. Passing Vet-Check, penned.
  - IV. Covid-affected exhibitor(s) must provide feed and bedding for animal for the duration of the Santa Cruz County Fair.
  - V. Animal will be shown by a volunteer, approved by the Livestock Superintendent, to determine market readiness.
  - VI. Upon determination of market readiness, animal will be listed for auction. Animal will go through auction sale. It is recommended Covid-affected exhibitor arrange a buyer for their animal.

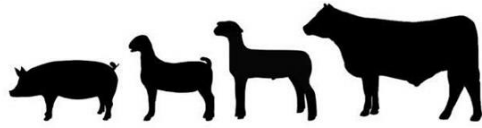
### Exhibitors with Covid/Covid Exposed During Fair

- A. Exhibitors experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 infection during the fair must immediately notify the Santa Cruz County Livestock Committee/Santa Cruz County Fair. - B. Exhibitors, or someone who is in their household, who has tested positive for COVID-19, are asked to leave the Santa Cruz County Fair or livestock shows. Any non-market animals must be removed from the fairgrounds. Exhibitor's market animal may still qualify for market and sale.
  - I. To qualify for sale; Covid-affected exhibitor must provide positive COVID-19 test documentation and/or exposure notice letter.

- II. Covid-affected exhibitor(s) must provide feed and bedding for animal for the duration of the Santa Cruz County Fair.
- III. If Exhibitor leaves before show day, animal will be shown by a volunteer, approved by the Livestock Superintendent, to determine market readiness.
- IV. Upon determination of market readiness, animal will be listed for auction. Animal will go through auction sale. It is recommended Covid-affected exhibitor arrange a buyer for their animal.

Carcass Animal Exhibitors who are Covid-affected may request a refund of entry fees. A note from your doctor or proof of positive test will be required.

The SCC Fair Livestock Committee, volunteers and Fair staff realize that there are quite a few items listed above and it will take additional thought and manpower to offer a livestock show/event during the COVID-19 response. We hope the information and protocols provided here will help exhibitors be successful and healthy while showing livestock at the Santa Cruz County Fair. We will take every precaution to ensure a safe environment for both exhibitors and animals, and will do our best to monitor and notify of possible Covid exposures to the best of our ability during this unpredictable time.
